Of the approximately 107 Billion human beings that have lived and died on planet Earth, Jesus Christ was by far the most outstanding, the most influential, and the most revered. Jesus fulfilled all the prophesies written about Him, including those describing His passion and death.

More human compassion and service efforts have been founded and financed by His followers than all other religions combined. Jesus is unparalleled as a "moral" influence. His life and teachings remain unsurpassed in their abilities to guide people and whole cultures toward altruism. He leads people out of confusion, doubt and misery. His artistic influence is also amazing. Jesus has inspired more of the world's great art, literature and music than any person who has ever lived.

In America alone, 128 colleges have been dedicated to His teachings and values.
